Dust jackets (dj) are mentioned, if present, with significant flaws described. Price clips (pc) are noted. Books are octavo in size unless otherwise indicated. "Wraps," means the book is softbound in some form of binding, usually stapled, glued, or plastic bindings. Bibliographical references are normally to the title, but not necessarily to the edition.
